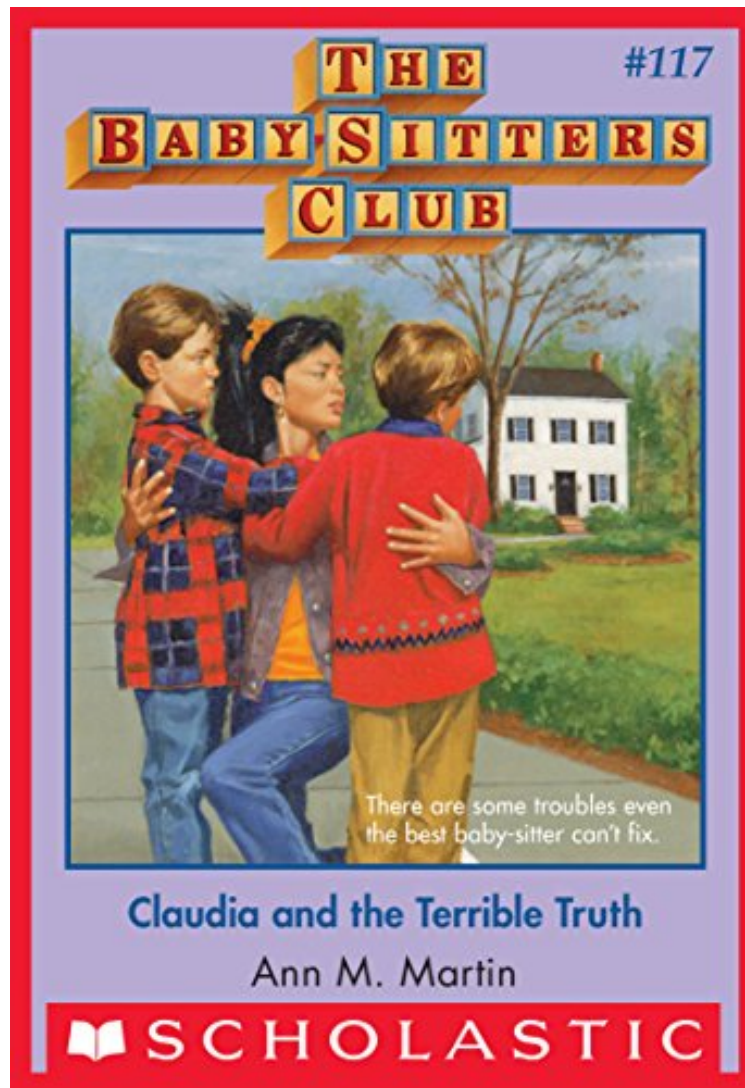

But the thing is, people interpret it more as PHYSICAL abuse instead of EMOTIONAL abuse. Mr. Nichols is not so much as physically abusive to his kids, he's
