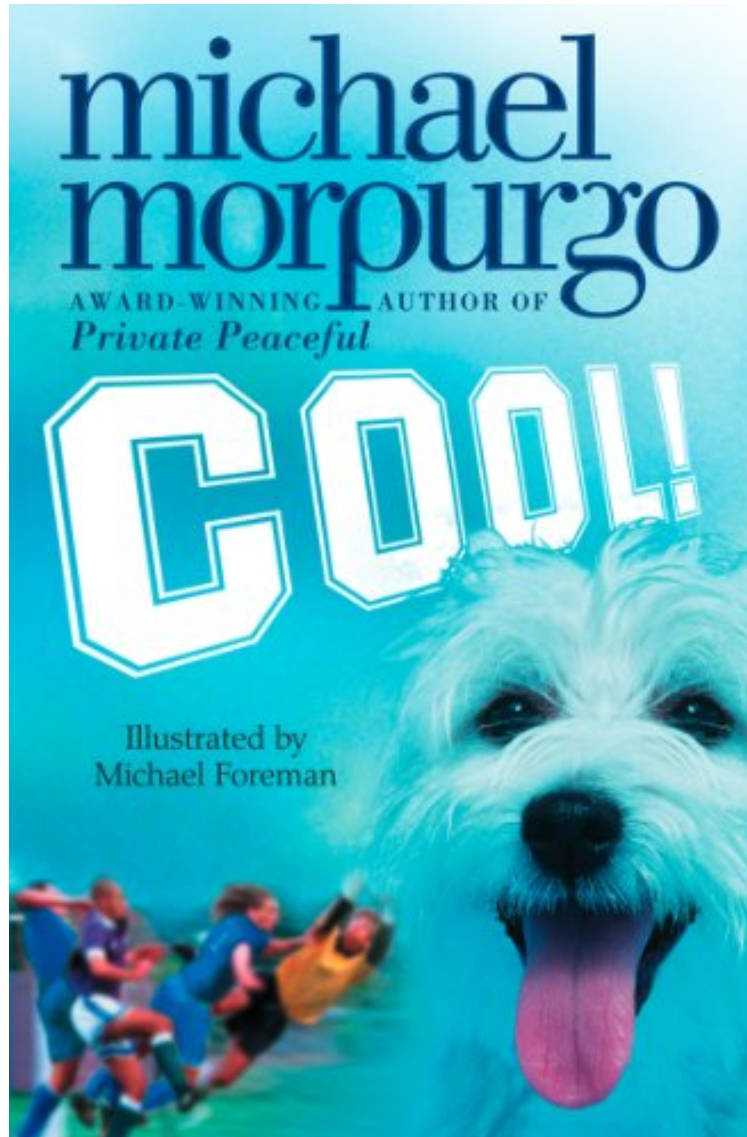

Umwelt dennoch wahr und schildert aus seiner Sicht das Verhalten seiner Familie und die sich daraus für ihn ergebenden Gefühlswelten. Seine Ängste, Hoffnungen, aber auch die seiner nächsten Angehörigen werden zuerst sensibel und nachfühlend beschrieben. Während es der Familie zunächst nicht gelingt, den Kontakt zu dem Jungen aufzubauen, da sie ja an seiner Wahrnehmungsfähigkeit große Zweifel hat, erreicht es die hingebungsvolle Krankenschwester, Robbie gelegentlich zumindest ein gewisses Wohlbefinden in seiner desolaten Situation zu verschaffen. Die Perspektive des Buches verführt den Leser zu neuen und guten Denkanstößen, zu mehr Sensibilität im Umgang mit persönlichen Katastrophen.
