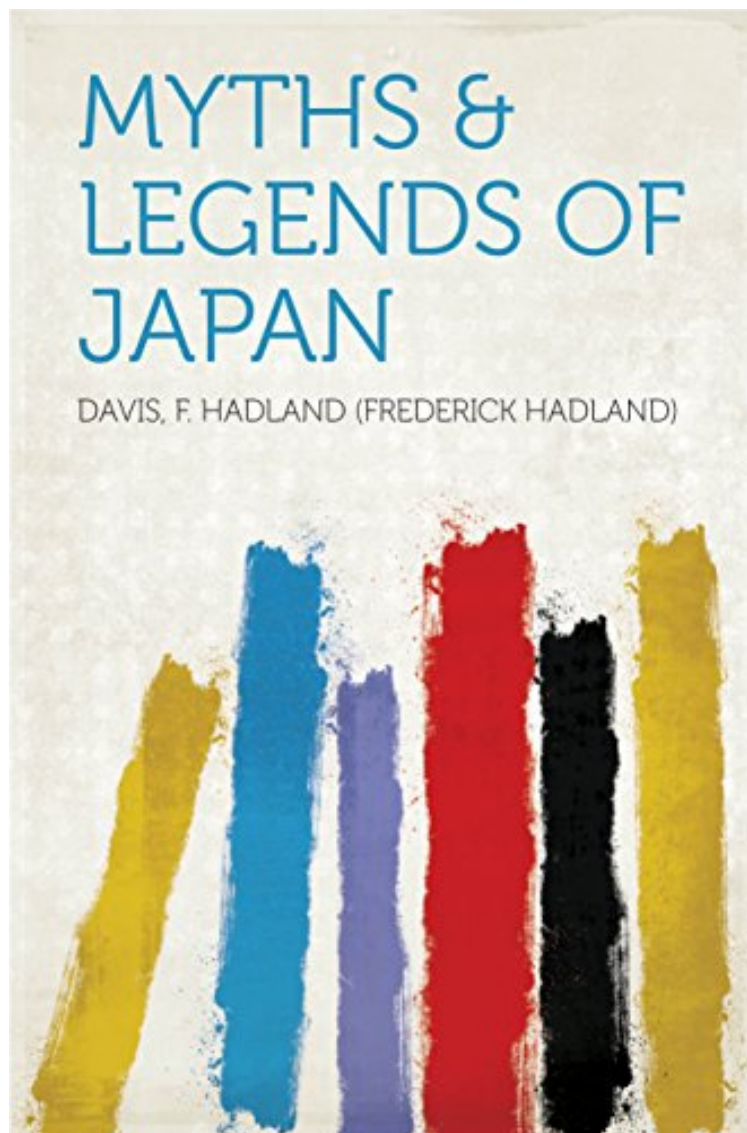

Nowadays Japan is seen as a modern and technologically innovative place, but in 1913, when *Myths and Legends of Japan* was first published, its culture seemed strange and exotic to the average Westerner.
