The state owns the remaining 2 percent. The sale price was not revealed, but the Maui News

previously reported the asking price was between \$500 million and \$600 million. Oracle reportedly plans to invest as much as another \$500 million to add to and improve the island's infrastructure and to create an environmentally-friendly agricultural industry.
