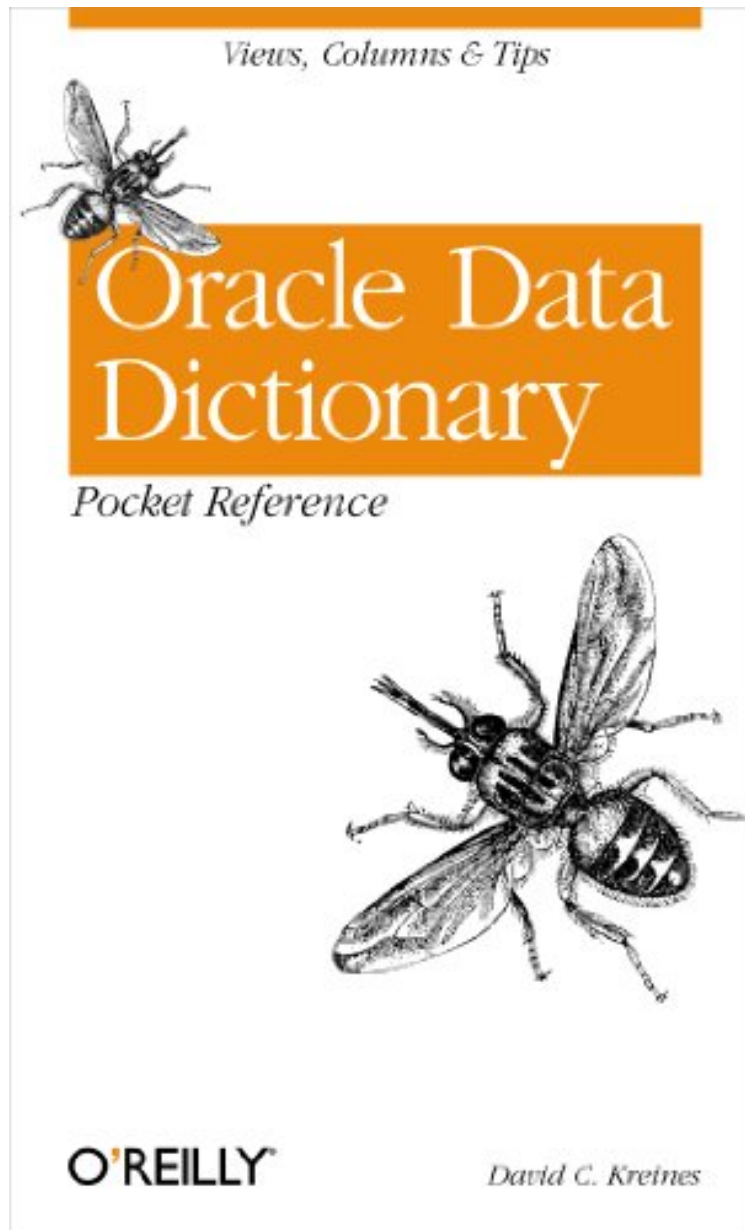

"ORACLE Data Dictionary Pocket Reference" beschreibt die (meisten) ORACLE Data Dictionary views. Das Buch sortiert bzw. gruppiert die Views in Gruppen zu einem bestimmten Thema z.B. "Replication". Im Regelfall findet man den View Namen, einen Satz Erklärung und die Liste der Spalten mit Datentyp und ggf. NOT NULL Kennzeichen. Zu manchen Views findet man noch eine kurze weitere Erklärung. Ich bin bekennender O'Reilly Fan und ich besitze alle O'Reilly ORACLE Bücher. Dieses Buch ist meiner Meinung nach berflssig und htte nie gedruckt werden sollen. In diesem Buch werden nur die Data Dictionary Views mit Namen und Spalten abgedruckt. Es gibt keine Information zu den Daten in den Spalten (Semantik) oder wie man die verschiedenen Views joinen kann, um mehr Informationen zu gewinnen. An ein paar Stellen gibt es Kommentare wie z.B. "Wenn man v\$session s und v\$process v zusammenjoin kann man mehr ber den Prozess erfahren". Leider fehlen dann die weitergehenden Informationen (s.paddr = p.addr). Meiner Meinung nach sollte man eher das ORACLE Database Reference Handbuch lesen und wenn man nicht weiter kommt bei Metalink nachschlagen. Die Informationen in "ORACLE Data Dictionary Pocket Reference" kann man mit SQL*Plus und einem kleinen Script selbst gewinnen. Im Vergleich zu einer besseren Online Dokumentation, bringt noch nicht einmal das Taschenformat dieses Buches einen entscheidenden Vorteil. Da das Buch nichts Falsches berichtet und die Form ganz OK ist (mit Suchindex) gebe ich 3 Punkte.
